Organic waste from canteen are collected separately and are later used as compost for garden. Liquid Waste Management Sewage water treatment plant is installed in the campus to manage waste. Then the water is reused for gardening and restrooms thereby reducing dependency on fresh water sources. Capacity of the treatment plant is 100000 per day. E-Waste Management E-Waste including computers, UPS, printers, and laboratory equipment's are collected and disposed periodically.

Water scarcity Due to global warming owing to pollutions in different forms, there is a scarcity of water everywhere, so saving rain water has become an essential need.
